




# **UPAWS Frequently Asked Questions**

### - Do you offer veterinary services?

Although we do not offer regular veterinary care to the public, we do have options available for those in need of assistance. Our Spay/ Neuter Assistance program aims to provide financial aid to pet owners who require aid with getting their pets spayed or neutered. Additionally, we offer convenient microchipping and nail trimming services for all pets.

### - Do you receive money from the state or other organizations?

We are a non-profit operating on the kindness and generosity of our community. We are supported financially through donations from our supporters and grants for which we apply. We do not receive any appropriated funding from the county, state, any national animal welfare group, or organization.

### - Do you offer discounts for adoption fees?

We frequently offer discounts on pet adoptions with many promotions and through pet sponsorships where community members make donations toward their adoption. Keep an eye on our website and social media pages for promotions!



- I cannot keep my pet. Can I bring it to UPAWS?

UPAWS is an open admission shelter. We do ask that you call ahead to schedule surrendering due to space limitations. The shelter can be stressful, so the UPAWS staff will present other alternatives.



Our shelter is dedicated to providing a safe haven for animals in need and we are proud to be classified as a no-kill shelter. We understand the importance of giving every animal the opportunity to find a loving forever home and ensure that they are never euthanized for reasons such as lack of space or time. We believe that every animal deserves a chance to heal and overcome any challenges, which is why we work tirelessly to do

everything we possibly can for those who may be sick or behaviorally challenged.

# Summertime Fun Time — Make it a Safe Time Too!



**Summertime is a great time to get out and have fun with your pet.** But it's important to keep your pet safe as you take in all the sights and sounds of the season. Here are five tips to ensure your pet has a safe and fun summer:

- 1. Invest in a martingale collar or a harness for your pet. This will help prevent your pet from slipping out of a normal collar while running around the park or beach.
- 2. Make sure your pet's ID tags are up to date. A lost pet can become a victim of the summertime heat, so attach an up-to-date ID tag to their collar.
- 3. Protect your pet's paws from hot asphalt or sand. Test the temperature of the pavement or sand with your own hand first or wait until the sun sets before taking your pet out for a run.
- 4. Provide plenty of fresh, clean water for your pet. A dehydrated pet can become sick or even die, so make sure to keep your pet's water bowl full and clean!
- 5. Avoid activities that may be too strenuous or dangerous for your pet. Even the most active and hardy of dogs may not be able to keep up with strenuous activities or extreme temperatures.

Our "Seniors for Seniors" adoption program is all about senior adopters rediscovering the joys of having a cat or dog in their lives. UPAWS will **waive the adoption fee** to encourage such placements of senior animals in loving homes.

60+ days is a long time for a shelter pet to wait for a family. Why is a pet waiting that long? Maybe they are older, not as outgoing, quiet, maybe they blend in, not as fancy looking as others. Most are simply overlooked, but will make wonderful family members if only given a chance. Because of this UPAWS offers the Lonely Hearts Program to any pet that has waited for over 60 days at UPAWS. Plus, Swick Home Services sponsors the adoption fee to help encourage people to take a second look at these deserving pets.
