Keep Calm & Help Your Cat: Litter Box Solutions

Did you know that litter box issues are a leading reason people give up on their cats? Don't worry — most problems can be fixed! **Cats love cleanliness**. If your cat stops using the litter box, there's always a reason, and **UPAWS** is here to help!

Here's some exciting news! **Cat ownership is booming**, with a 23% rise in cat-owning households across the country in 2024! **Let's keep our feline friends joyful and at home**.

If your cat starts going outside the litter box, the first step is to **contact your veterinarian** and have your cat's urine checked. A **urinary tract infection (UTI)** can cause significant pain and lead to accidents outside the box. UTIs can be serious, especially for male cats. **Always rule out health issues first!**

Here are other typical reasons and ways to help:

✓ Not Fixed? They Might Be Spraying

Cats that aren't spayed or neutered often spray to mark their territory. Getting your cat spayed or neutered helps prevent this.

✓ Keep It Clean!

Cats don't like a dirty box. Scoop at least twice a day.

▼ Too Few Boxes

The minimum number of litter boxes recommended for your house is one litter box per cat, plus an extra one.

✓ Wrong Box or Litter

Seniors and kittens may require a low-entry box. Big cat? Bigger box! Most cats like unscented litter.

Chistery had a UTI - yup, even kittens can get a bladder infection.
10 days of general antibiotics and he was back in tip-top spirits!

✓ Stress

Big changes, such as moving, acquiring new pets, or having visitors, can cause stress in your cat. Try to keep their routine the same. Plug-ins like Feliway® can help calm them down.

✓ Clean Up the Right Way

To prevent your cat from returning to the same spot, use pet-safe enzyme cleaners, such as Nature's Miracle®. Enzyme cleaners break down the waste and other substances in cat urine that cause odors, so your cat is unlikely to return to that area to urinate again.

Never Punish Your Cat!

Shouting or punishing your cat isn't effective and can even make things worse. Cats don't respond well to negative actions, and it might cause them to become afraid of you. It is always best to remain patient and calm.
